Annual Events. . .

- Uffda Day: The first Sunday in October brings thousands to town to enjoy the parade, demonstrations, Scandinavian foods, classic car show, quilt display, crafts sales and more. Participate or just watch the Wife Carrying Contest.

Rutland hosts several other events including:

- Community Play: Third weekend of March is a fun event starring local residents.
- Fish Fry: Rutland Sportsman's Club annual fish fry the first Friday in March sells over 700 tickets. Get yours early!
- Men's Slowpitch Softball: Tournament each June for area and visiting teams. Sponsored by the Rutland Park Board.
- "Youth Day": Each August at the Rifle Range near Silver Lake sponsored by the Rutland Sportsman's Club.
- Children's Theater: August youth theater production highlights local talent and budding thespians.
- BBQ Cook Off: Compete with residents and others and then enjoy the street dance! Sponsored by The Lariat Bar.

Fun Things to Do. . .

Silver Lake Park. . .

Two miles south of Rutland enjoy this 100-acre park open yearly from May 1st to October 1st. The Park, owned by Sargent County, has campsites with electric hookups.

Rutland has six RV campsites with electric hookups within City limits. Check the City's website for more information.



Fishing. . .

Rutland is the gateway to hunting, fishing, camping and swimming areas. Buffalo Lake, one of Southeast North Dakota's premier ice fishing lakes, is six miles north of Rutland and one mile east on County Roads 10 and 10A. Northern pike and perch are caught year round.

Tewaukon National Wildlife Refuge

Sprague Lake Unit is two miles southwest of Rutland. The headquarters and Lake Tewaukon are five miles south of Cayuga.
